Year Four Second Quarter Activity Report

January – March 2009

Executive Summary

During the second quarter of the fourth year (January- March 2009), Takamol Team has continued implementing training activities of results 1, 2 and 4 following the agreed upon training plan and timetable.

This report covers 42 training courses conducted successfully during this Second Quarter (January-March 2009):

- 20 training courses at PHC level under result 1.
 - 10 training courses at Hospital level under result 2.
 - 12 training courses at PHC level under result 4.
- Three clinical ultrasonic training courses for PHC physicians were conducted at the regional center for training (RCT) and included participants from Dakahlia, Beni Suef, Quena, 6th October, Luxor & Ismailia Governorates.
 - In the 42 courses, the total number of trainees under the three Results was 1048 participants. The total number of training days was 139 training days which means that during the 42 courses a total of 3186 participants' training days were accomplished.
 - This means that *Takamol Team* succeeded to conduct daily, as an average, 1.9 training days per each working day during this second quarter.

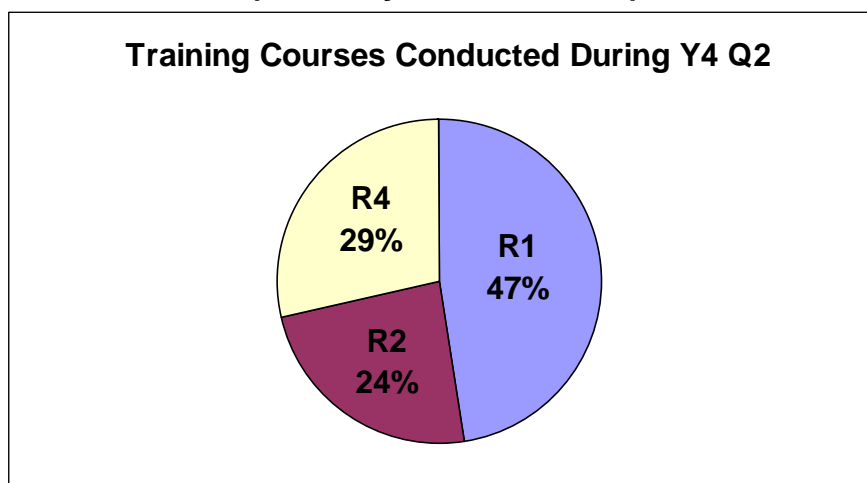

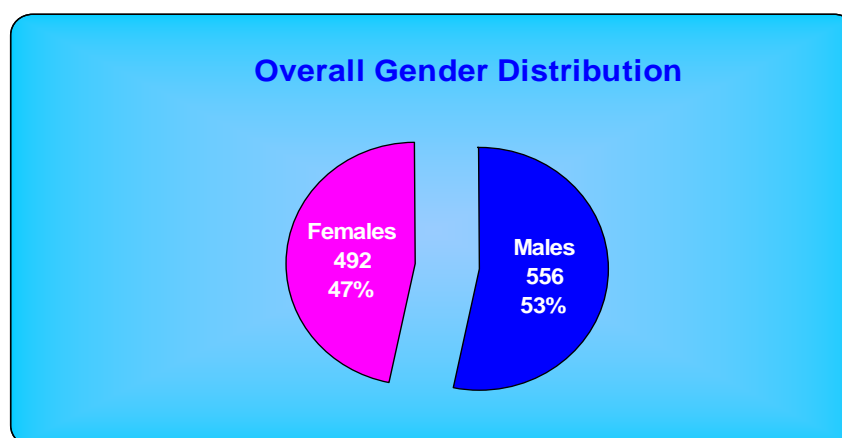

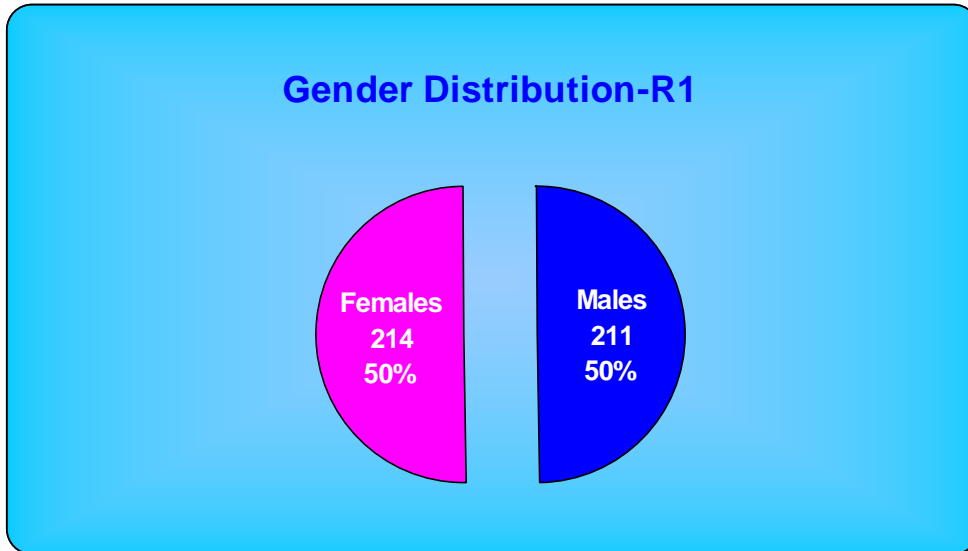

(January- March 2009)**

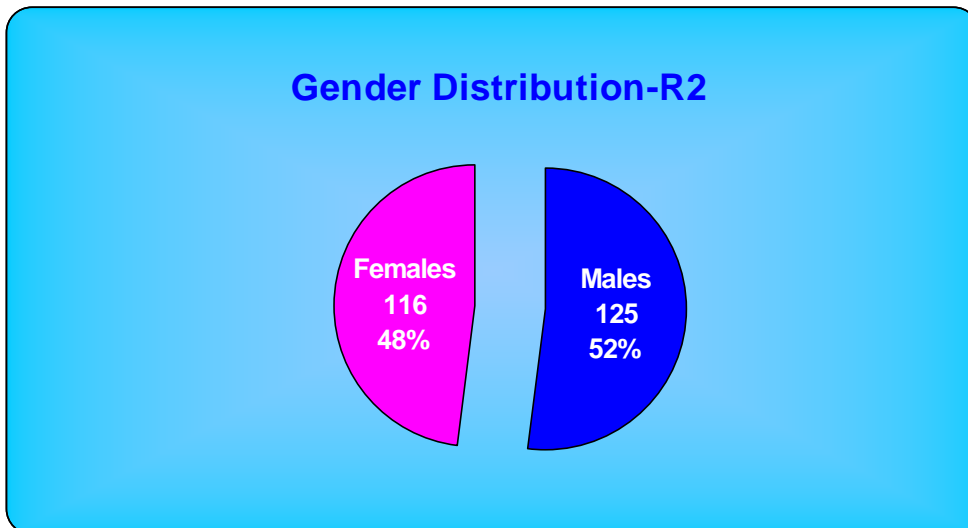


Graph 2 shows that the gender ratio for this second quarter (January- March 2009) was in favor of males (53%).

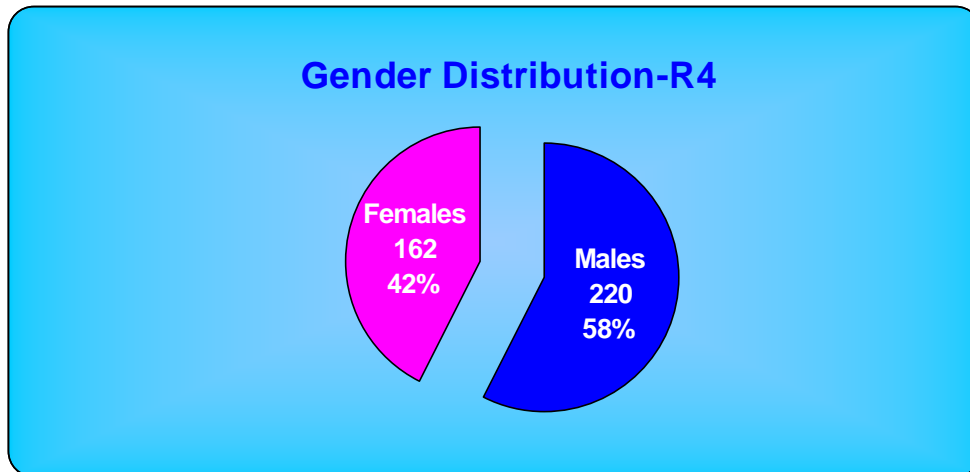
**Graph 3: Gender Distribution among R1 Training Courses

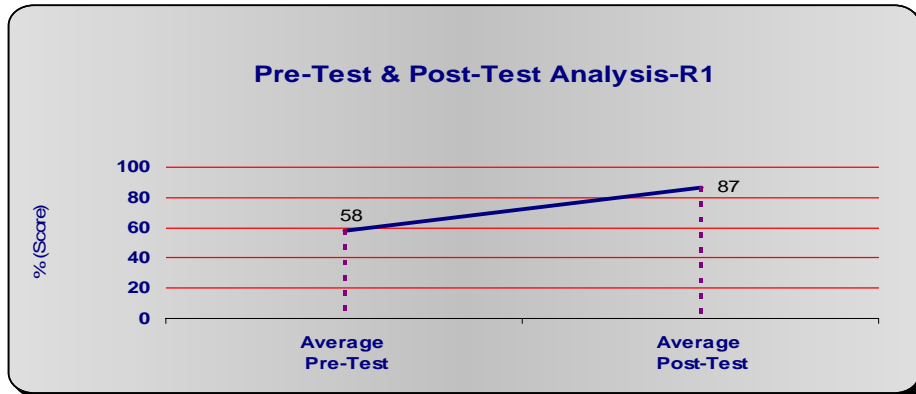

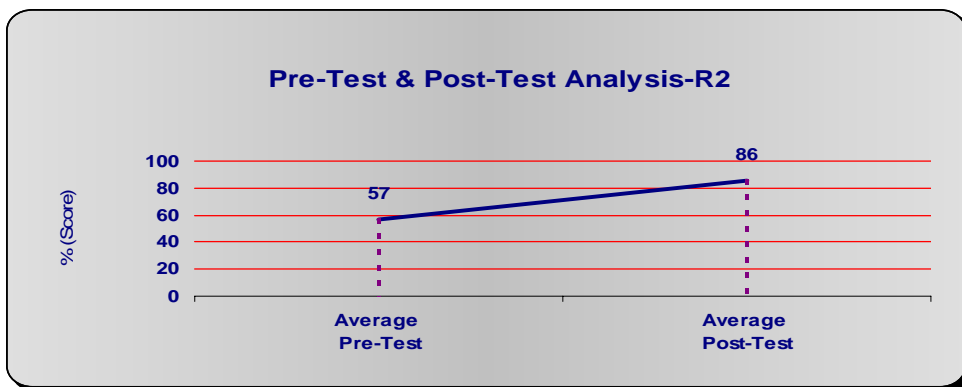
Table 6 summarizes the monthly average pre/ post test per result.

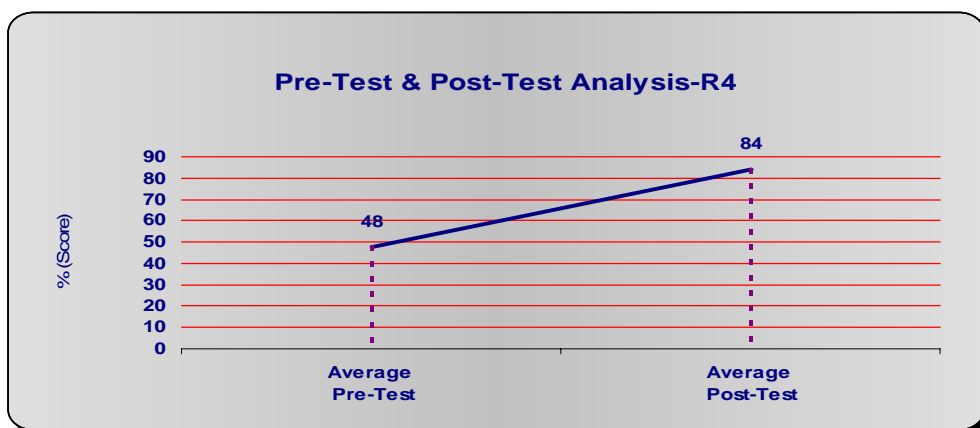
Graph 6: Pre/ Post Test Analysis of R1 Courses



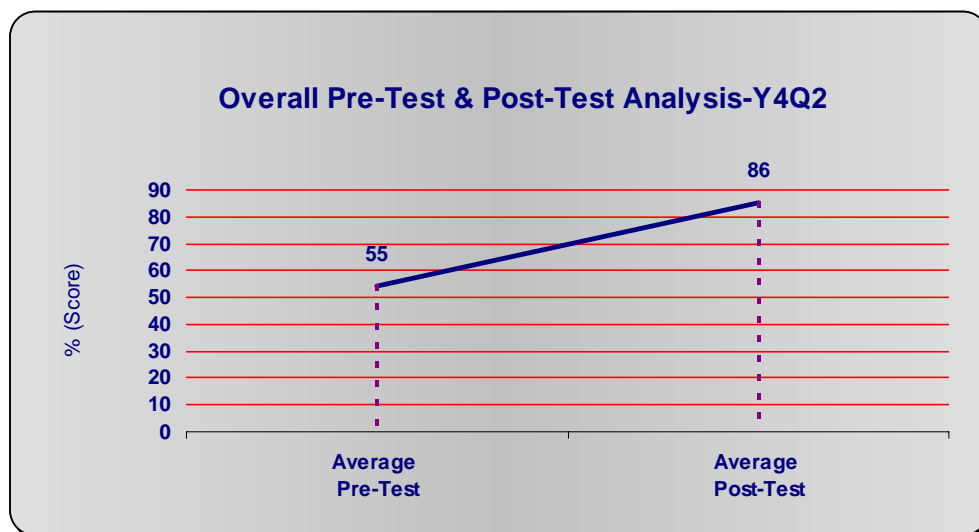
Graph 7: Pre/ Post Test Analysis of R2 Courses

Graph 9: Pre/ Post Test Analysis of all Courses

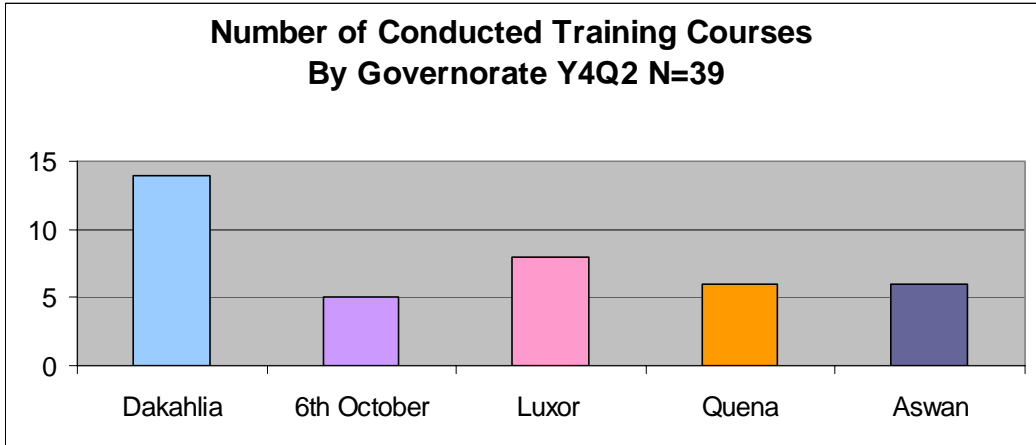

Graph 11: Distribution of Training Courses Among Governorates

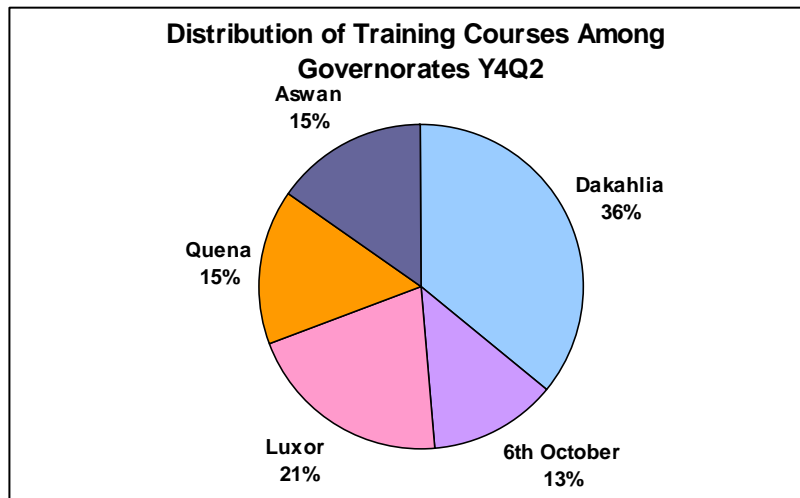

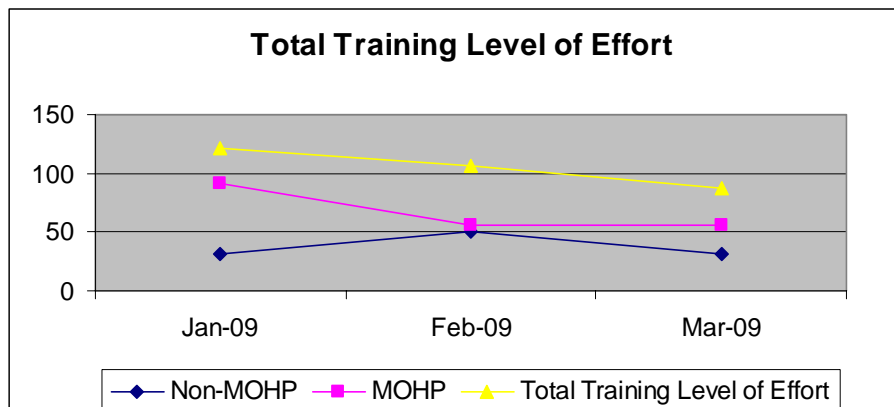

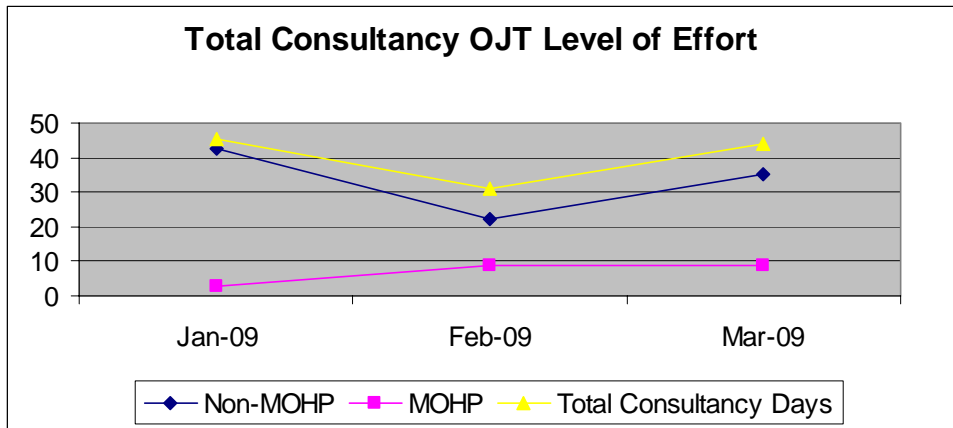
Trainers/Consultants' Level of Effort

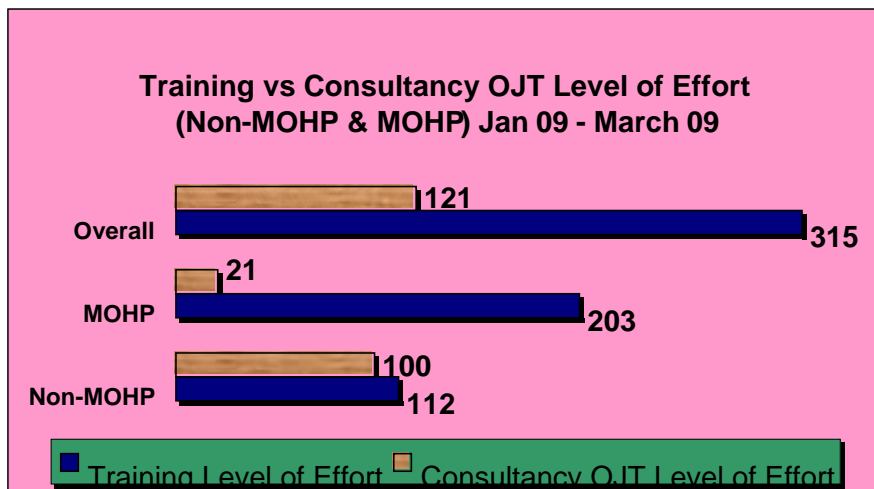
Graph 12: Total Training Level of Effort Jan – March 09
